What are preferential tariffs in Lebanon?

Preferential tariffs shall apply to all goods or part thereof originating from a country or a group of countries with which Lebanon is bound by special Customs agreements that qualify these goods for preferential treatment within limits of said agreements.

What are Lebanese tariffs?

The primary purpose of these tariffs is to regulate trade and to protect domestic producers by making imported goods less competitive. The Lebanese Customs Administration utilizes a specific tariff classification system based on the Harmonized System (HS) codes.

How do tariffs and duties affect international trade in Lebanon?

In Lebanon, tariffs and duties play a crucial role in international trade, impacting the cost of imported and exported goods. Tariffs are taxes imposed on imports and, in certain cases, exports, usually calculated as a percentage of the goods' value.

Can I import a car into Lebanon for repair purposes?

The Director General of Customs may, under the conditions stipulated in Article 269 and subsequent Articles of this law, allow temporary duty-free import of automobiles into Lebanon for repair purposes, provided such automobiles are re-exported within six months after the date of registration of their Customs procedures.
